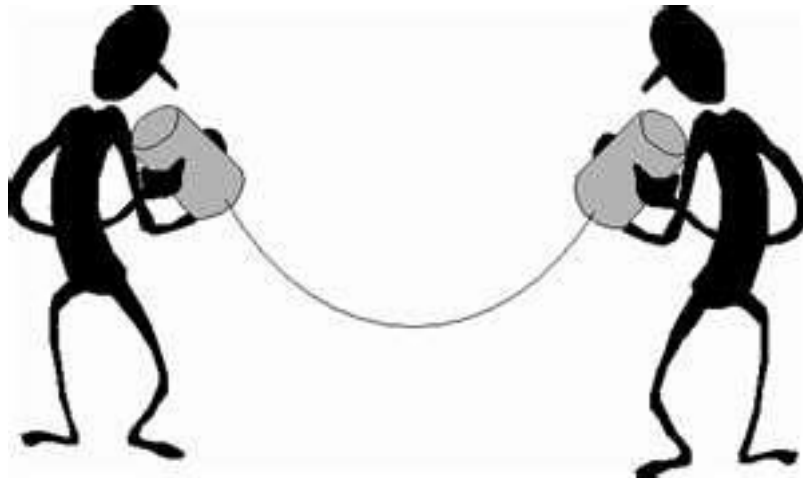
- The more we give, the happier we feel.

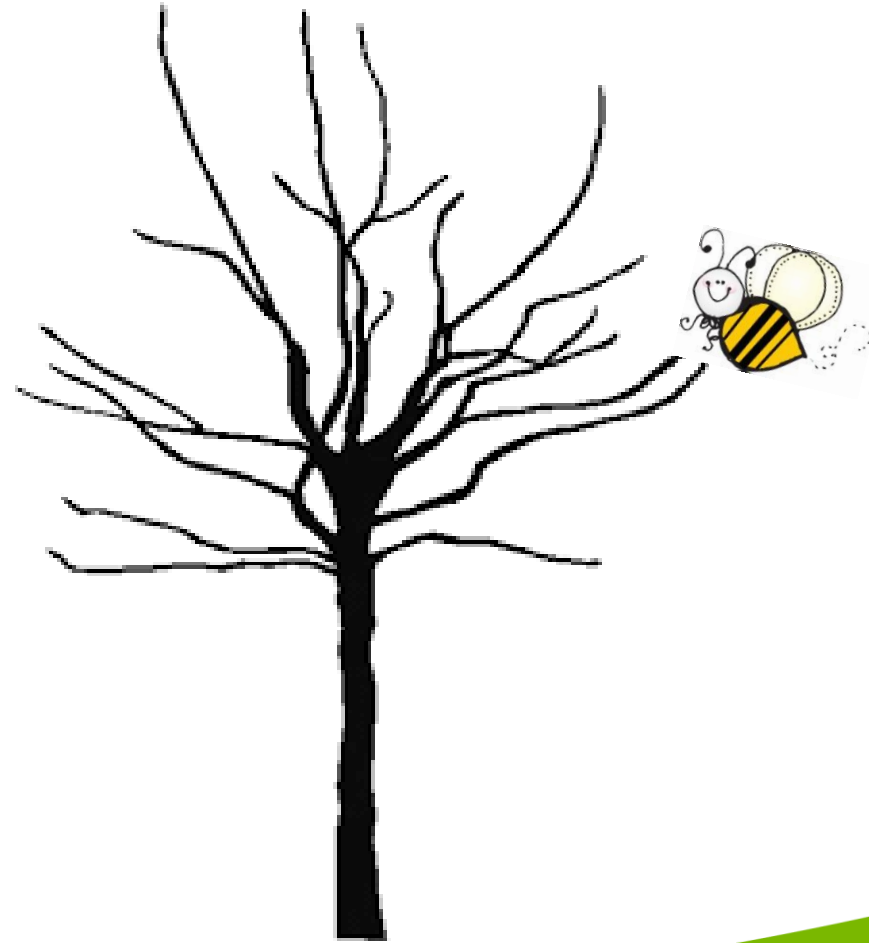
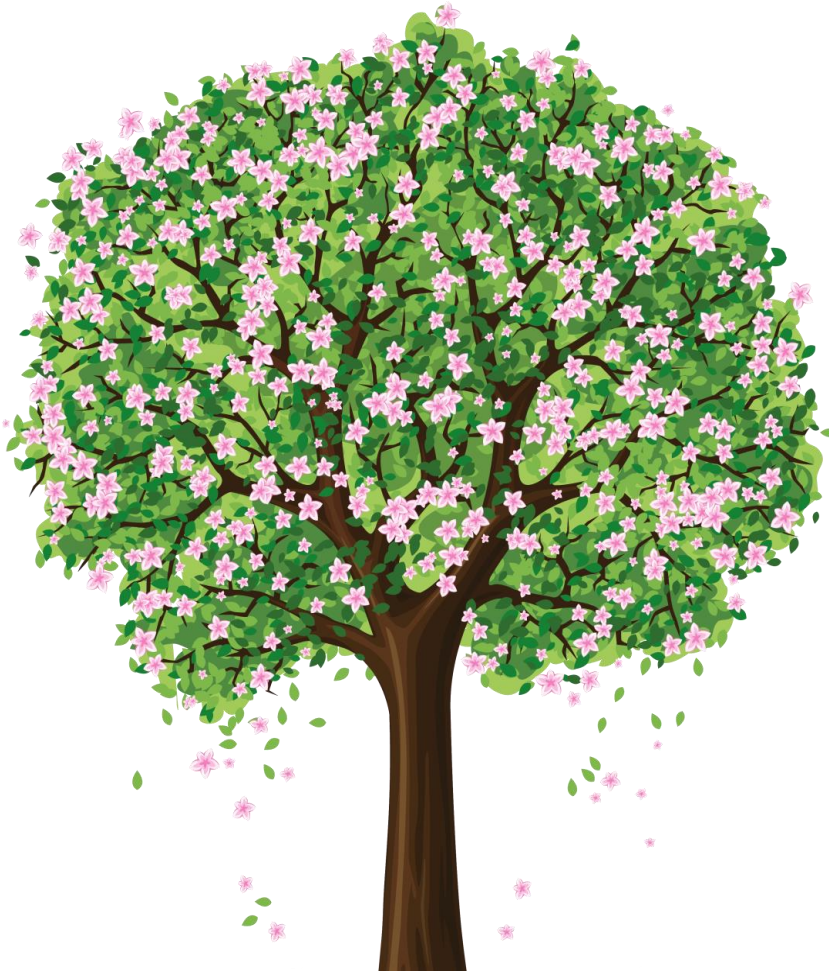

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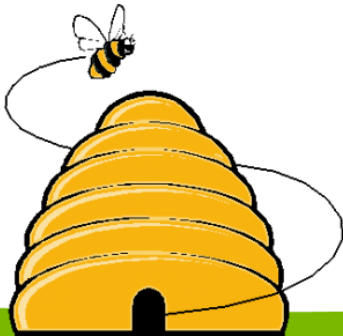
